

Holton USD #336 District Plan for Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services

PART I.

Describe how the district will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff and the extent to which it has adopted policies, and a description of any such policies, on each of the following safety recommendations established by the CDC:

(A) Universal and correct wearing of masks:

Our school district has made masks optional. Masks are still recommended for individuals who present COVID like symptoms and wish to come to school. The school district can still test students and staff who request a COVID-19 test.

If needed, we may adopt reasonable safety measures to protect the safety of district personnel, students, and visitors during school-related activities. Reasonable safety measures may include, but may not be limited to, cleaning and sanitization plans. Exceptions to any requirements may be granted as required by law, state, county, and/or local health officials, and on a case-by-case basis. We will continue to monitor national, state, and local government and health agency mandates, guidance, and recommendations as well.

(B) Modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing (e.g., use of cohorts/podding).

When necessary, social distancing practices can be utilized.

(C) Handwashing and respiratory etiquette.

Handwashing and respiratory etiquette will continue to be taught to students with emphasis and practice protocols rehearsed more frequently in the primary grade levels. Signage will continue to be posted throughout our buildings as reminders of handwashing and respiratory etiquette.

(D) Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation.

Custodial staff have been and will continue to follow specific cleaning protocols and procedures. We will continue to consider assignments/reassignments to applicable shifts in order to continually clean high traffic and high contact surfaces. Our district will continue to use cleaning solutions that are rated to eliminate the COVID-19 virus. We will continue to monitor ventilation efficiency and effectiveness for opportunities to continually improve air quality.

(E) Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State, local, territorial, or Tribal health departments.

Administration will assist as required by our local health department guidelines and recommendations.

(F) Diagnostic and screening testing.

Students, staff, and community members can access COVID-19 diagnostic or screening tests through their local health care provider or a test from the school can be utilized.

(G) Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities.

Our district will participate and partner with vaccination efforts in accordance with state and federal law for staff and eligible student groups.



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(H) Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies.

Our district will provide reasonable, necessary, and appropriate accommodations to its policies and practices for students with disabilities as determined by individual student needs and in accordance with an individual's documented accommodations and/or individualized education plan (IEP) or 504. Parents or guardians of students requiring accommodations should contact the applicable building administrator(s) to request information on plans for students with disabilities

(I) Coordination with State and local health officials.

Applicable district personnel currently participate, and will continue to participate, with our local county health department and/or agencies on a frequent basis to determine next steps as needed.

Part II. Describe how the district will ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to:

(A) Services to address students' academic needs

Our district plans to continue full time, in-person instruction. Our stakeholders want more social emotional learning opportunities for students who need them. Our district has adopted new curriculum in reading and mathematics to help with academic needs.

(B) Students' and staff social, emotional, mental health

Our district has K-12 staff to monitor and address the social and emotional learning needs of our students. We will continue to support our social worker and school counselors and partner with local mental health services with the goal of helping students and families overcome obstacles with connecting to school.

Our district has provided staff with opportunities for social and emotional supports. Staff social and emotional wellness and mental health are also considered in district communications and staff committees.

(C) Other needs, which may include student health and food services.

Free meals have been made available each summer when school is out. Families may also be in contact with their child's school for any other health or food service needs.

STAGE 4: Endemic

	PreK - 12 Grade
Illness	 Staff and students who do not feel well SHOULD STAY HOME! If developing symptoms at school, the staff member or student will be sent home IMMEDIATELY! If sent home, the staff member or student will not return that day or the next. Staff or students who have a fever but not COVID, must be fever free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication.
COVID - Positive Case	 Isolate for 5 days End isolation after 5 days if: Fever free without medication for 24 hours Other symptoms improve Well-fitting mask for 5 more days – No activities where a mask cannot be worn during the activities, including but not limited to, high risk sports or PE. Student may ride school transportation.
Close Contact	 Being within 6 feet of the person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period. If parents believe their child has been exposed to a positive case either at school or elsewhere, they should monitor their child for symptoms. A mask is recommended.
Extra-Curricular Activities	Follow COVID Positive Case requirements above.
Masks	Optional (Unless COVID positive after day 5 and wanting to attend School)
Bussing	Masks are only required for COVID positive cases after day 5 (see above).
